Ser No	Questions/Conditions	Answers
1.	Is there any preparation required before coming for AFMC Interview cum Medicals?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Get your ear checked and remove wax, if any. - Reduce weight if you are overweight. - You will be asked to come empty stomach on Day 2. - Bring records of any past surgery/medical documents, if any.
2.	Is phimosis a ground for rejection?	<p>Current phimosis, if tight enough to interfere with local hygiene and voiding and/or Balanitis xerotica obliterans is a ground of rejection/ Unfit.</p> <p>Operated cases (after 02 weeks) provided the wound is fully healed and no post op complications can be considered Fit.</p>
3.	I had an Eye surgery in the past, can I be considered fit during medical examination?	<p>After any extra ocular surgery, a symptoms free period of minimum 03 months is required for assessment.</p> <p>LASIK is not permitted in less than 20 years of age.</p>
4.	What are the accepted visual standards for medical fitness?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Uncorrected VA 6/36 & 6/36; BCVA 6/6 and 6/6. (ii) Myopia \leq -3.50 D Sph, including max astigmatism \leq +/- 2.0 D Cyl. (iii) Hypermetropia \leq +3.50 DSph, including max astigmatism \leq +/- 2.0 D Cyl. (iv) Lasik or equivalent not permitted in less than 20 year of age. (v) Colour vision- CP II
5.	I am using dental braces/ prosthesis. Is it a cause of concern during medical examination?	<p>No, however all removable dental prostheses/appliances will be removed before examination.</p>
6.	What are the criteria for medical fitness if I undergo any surgical procedure?	<p>Candidates will be considered fit only after the minimum laid down period following surgery is over and there are no complication or residual effects. Minimum period following various type of surgeries are as follow-</p> <p>Laparotomy - 24 weeks of from the date of surgery. Hernia related- 12 weeks of from the date of surgery. Laparoscopic Cholecystectomy and appendectomy – 08 weeks from the date of surgery. For any other surgery - a minimum 02 weeks following surgery provided the scar is well healed and there is no proof of complications.</p>

7.	Will I be subjected to any investigations during medical examination?	<p>Following investigations will be carried out for all candidates as a part of medical examination-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Complete haemogram - Urine RE & ME - X- Ray Chest PA view, - Resting ECG - USG Abdomen & Pelvis. <p>For USG abdomen, you will be required to come empty stomach.</p>
8.	What are the common reasons for rejection on medical ground?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Overweight/Obesity. - Refractive error beyond permissible limits - Phimosis in boys.
9.	Is there any provision for Appeal if declared Unfit during medical examination?	<p>Yes, Candidates found unfit may appeal against the findings of Initial Medical Board. A separate Appeal Medical Board will be convened within 24 hours of appeal. Please keep one extra day for appeal medical board.</p>
